Why Charles I can't get out of political crisis as King John did by signing the Magna Carta?	Rise of capitalist mode of production and growth of bourgeois who demanded their interests and rights in state affairs --Reasons for this rise and growth: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ Wars of the Roses weakened feudal noble class; ♦ The Enclosure, development of wool industry and towns shattered foundation of great estates economy which was the basis of feudal powers; ♦ Geographical discovery and overseas expansion sped up the "primitive accumulation of capital"; ♦ Reformation deprived lands and wealth of churches; ♦ New thoughts freed people from beliefs serving feudal relations
What is Restoration of Stuart?	In the Civil War, Protector Cromwell established the Commonwealth but after his death, his successor couldn't unite the Commonwealth, so in 1660, the son of the beheaded king Charles I of Stuart House, Charles II was welcomed back to the throne for he promised religious toleration and respect for existing property relations. The period of Charles II's reign is called the Restoration of Stuart.
